**RODNEY BLEVINS** President & CEO, Southeast Energy Group **Dominion Energy** 

Rodney Blevins is President and CEO of Southeast Energy Group, where he oversees Dominion Energy's regulated utility businesses in Georgia and the Carolinas. He joined Richmond, VA-based Dominion in June 1987 as an associate engineer and held several positions across its electric distribution business, including responsibility

for the System Storm Center from 1999 to 2013. Rodney was named Vice President of Distribution Operations in 2006, which included oversight of the company's electric distribution assets. He was appointed Senior Vice President and Chief Information Officer in January 2014 and assumed his current role in January 2019 upon the completion of Dominion's merger with SCANA Corporation. Rodney is a graduate of Virginia Tech and completed the Advanced Management Program at Duke University's Fugua School of Business.



**CHRIS CHUNG** CEO **Economic Development Partnership of NC** 

Chris Chung has been CEO of the Economic Development Partnership of North Carolina (EDPNC) since 2015, bringing more than 20 years of state-level economic development experience to that role. As a public-private partnership, EDPNC is responsible for numerous economic development functions on behalf of the State

of North Carolina, including business recruitment, existing industry support, international trade and export assistance, small business counseling, and tourism, sports and film promotion. With its staff of more than 60 professionals, EDPNC advances the economic interests of all 100 North Carolina counties. Chris previously held leadership positions at the Missouri Partnership (2007-2014) and the Ohio Department of Development, now known as JobsOhio (1997-2007). He attended The Ohio State University, graduating Phi Beta Kappa with a double-major in Japanese and economics. Chris also completed significant coursework towards a master's in Public Policy and Management.



**TONY COPELAND** Secretary **NC Department of Commerce** 

Tony Copeland became North Carolina's Secretary of Commerce in January 2017, named to the post by Governor Roy Cooper. He brings a unique 360-degree perspective on the factors driving today's corporate investment and site decisions. Earlier in his career, Secretary Copeland served as an Assistant Commerce Secretary, working

with international companies from China, Japan, Europe, South Korea, and Israel, as well as a wide variety of domestic businesses. He also brought significant new corporate investment into North Carolina as part of his site selection work at a major Raleigh law firm. From 1992 to 2003, Secretary Copeland served as Executive Vice President, Secretary, and General Counsel at BTI, a competitive telecommunications company, where he led the company's growth from \$38 million in revenues to more than \$250 million. A native of the town of Hertford, NC, he is a graduate of Duke University and the Western Michigan University School of Law.





**SCOTT DORNEY Executive Director NC Military Business Center** 

Scott Dorney has served as Executive Director of the North Carolina Military Business Center (NCMBC) since 2004. A statewide component of the NC Community College System with headquarters at Fayetteville Tech Community College, the NCMBC is a business development organization that connects North Carolina businesses to

federal contracts, links military veterans and other jobseekers to employment, and supports the recruitment of defense contractors to North Carolina. Prior to joining NCMBC, Scott served for six years as the Chief Officer for Support Services for the City of Fayetteville and served nearly 22 years on active duty as a commissioned officer in the United States Army. Originally from Allentown, PA, he is a graduate of The Citadel and received his master's from Columbia University.



**DANNY GIDDENS** Assistant Secretary, Division of Workforce Solutions **NC Department of Commerce** 

Danny Giddens is Assistant Secretary of Division of Workforce Solutions with the NC Department of Commerce. He assumed this leadership role in late 2017 after serving as the Division's Director of Field Operations. In that capacity, he provided policy direction and strategic oversight of activities associated with the Workforce

Innovation & Opportunity Act Title I, Trade Act, Title III Employment Services, Special Programs, and the Management Information System group. Prior to moving to North Carolina in 2001, Danny served more than 15 years as director of a local workforce development board in Georgia. He is a graduate of Georgia Southwestern State University where he also received his master's.



**CHRIS HARRINGTON** Director of Operations & General Manager Elastics Therapy Inc.

Chris Harrington leads a medical device manufacturing business of 225 people that includes three youth apprentices. Prior to joining Elastic Therapy in 2012, he held various senior level roles in manufacturing, distribution and supply-chain management at Sony, Technicolor and other companies. He also served in leadership roles in the

US Army. Chris co-chairs Apprenticeship Randolph (Youth Apprenticeship Consortium), which he helped start along with 11 other businesses, K-12 officials, community college representatives, state apprenticeship leaders, and mentors from existing apprenticeship programs. He is involved in many of the local and regional workforce committees and initiatives and is a Workforce Board member. Chris holds an Executive MBA from University of Tennessee with a focus on Strategic Leadership. He is currently a Ph.D candidate at NC A&T State University with a focus in Leadership Studies.

**JENNI HARRIS Executive Director, Business Services NC Department of Commerce** 

Dr. Jenni Harris is Executive Director of Business Services at the NC Department of Commerce's Division of Workforce Solutions. As a senior level strategist and advisor, she provides vision and leadership in aligning the state's economic and workforce development programs. Harris oversees the management of federally funded

initiatives such as Rapid Response, Work Opportunity Tax Credits and Business Edge – a new layoff-aversion strategy designed to help North Carolina businesses avoid closure. Her collaborative leadership has resulted in the development and nurturing of partnership opportunities with the NC Community College System, the Small Business and Technology Development Center (SBTDC), NCSU's Industry Expansion Solutions program, the NC Film Commission, the Department of Health and Human Services and other organizations. Harris received a BA from UNC Wilmington and graduated Summa Cum Laude from NC Central University with an MPA. She earned a doctorate in Public Policy and Administration from West Chester University.

Stacey began this position after 22 years as Membership and Events Director at the Asheboro/Randolph Chamber of Commerce, where she worked closely with Randolph County's movers and shakers.
