## THE HONORABLE TONY COPELAND

## NC Department of Commerce

Tony Copeland was appointed NC Secretary of Commerce in January 2017 by Governor Roy Cooper. He brings a unique 360-degree perspective on the factors driving today's corporate investment and site decisions. Earlier in his career, Secretary Copeland served as Assistant Commerce Secretary, working with international companies

from China, Japan, Europe, South Korea and Israel, as well as a wide variety of domestic businesses. He also brought significant new corporate investment into North Carolina as part of his site selection consulting work at a major Raleigh law firm. From 1992-2003, Secretary Copeland served as Executive Vice President, Secretary and General Counsel at BTI, a competitive telecommunications company, where he led the company's growth from \$38 million in revenues to more than \$250 million. A native of the town of Hertford, he is a graduate of Duke University and the Western Michigan University School of Law.

# DONNY HICKS

#### Executive Director Gaston County Economic Development Commission

Donny Hicks is Executive Director of the Gaston County Economic Development Commission, a position he has held for 35 years. The EDC is a unit of county government charged with recruiting new business, retaining existing companies, marketing and the development of public and private business parks. NCEDA named Donnie

Economic Developer of the Year in 2001 and again in 2009. He also is a Past President of NCEDA. In 2005, Donnie was selected by the *Gaston Gazette* as its Person of the Year. He currently serves as Treasurer of the North Carolina Community College Foundation Board. Donnie graduated *cum laude* from UNC Charlotte and holds an MPA from UNC Chapel Hill. Donnie also is a graduate of the Economic Development Institute and the Economic Development Executive Program at the University of Oklahoma.



# JEFF HICKS Resilience Analytics Lead and CEO Fernleaf Interactive

He previously worked as a software engineer with UNC Asheville's NEMAC and Locus Technologies, helping develop high-profile environmental assessment applications for the White House and various federal agencies as well as companies that include Chevron, Dow Chemical, DuPont, Intel and Lockeed Martin.
