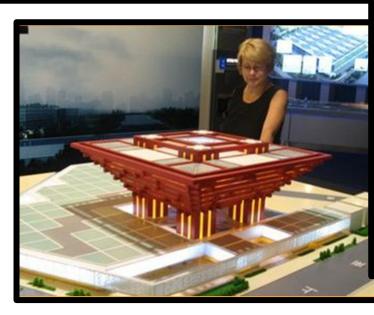

NC — Economic transformation is occurring

- 10th largest state
 - Gained a Congressional seat
- Tremendous national / international reputation
- Transformational engines
 - Mega-projects
 - Population growth
 - Retirees / Remote workers
 - Economic development infrastructure
 - NC Legislative commitment to site development
 - Golden LEAF unique asset



NC — Economic transformation is occurring

- Mostly in the Piedmont
 - In past, Piedmont had what clients wanted at an affordable cost
 - Farmers began receiving Tobacco Buyout funds
 - Land becoming more available
 - Running out of space for industrial growth
 - Includes a significant change to how economic development is handled

- Even clients are involved



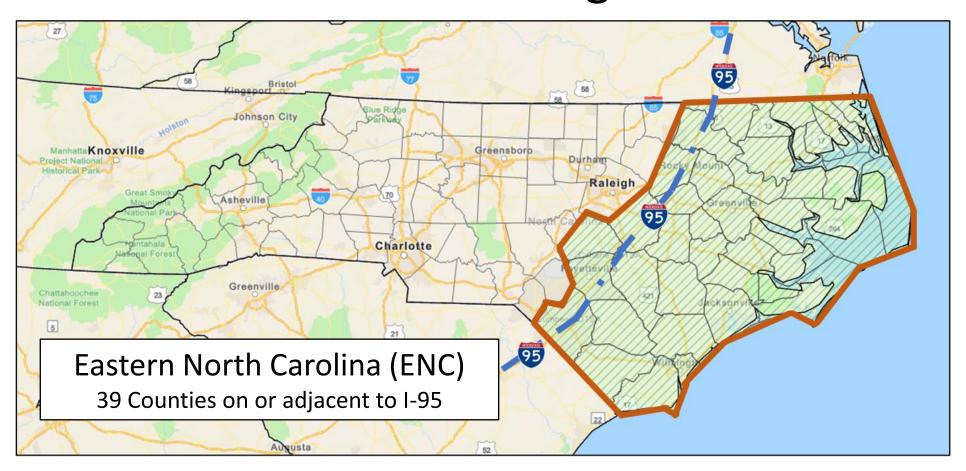
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TRANSFORMATION

 - Limiting factors
- Counties / towns responsible for new sites
- Almost no speculative projects started
 - Private developers are in certain areas

Eastern NC Region

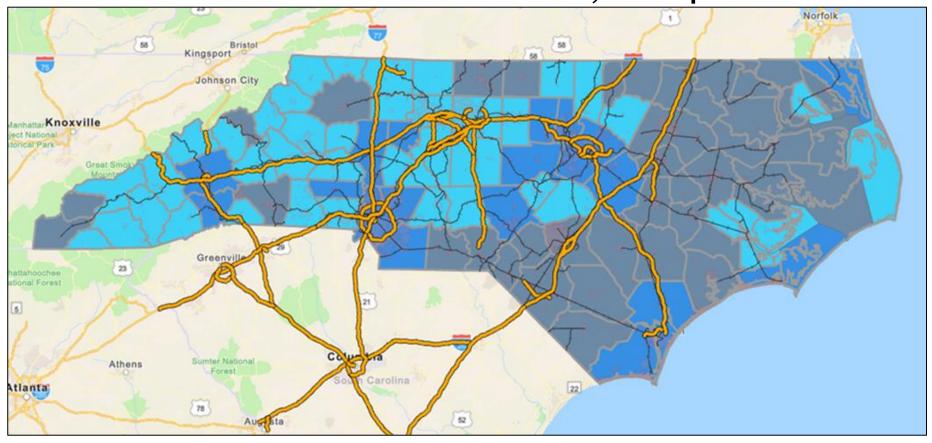

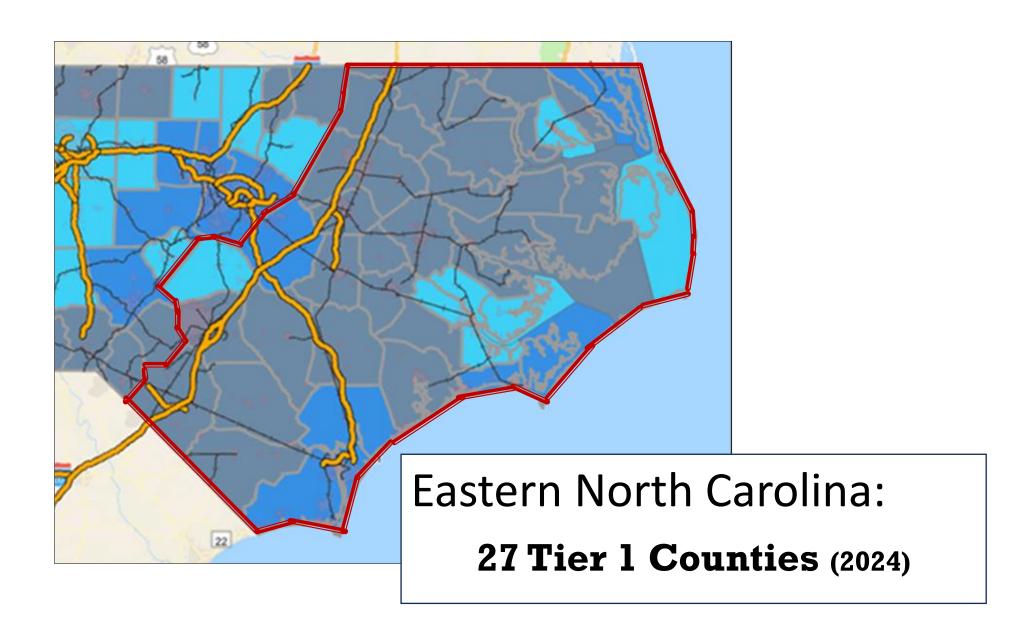


North Carolina Tiers, 2024



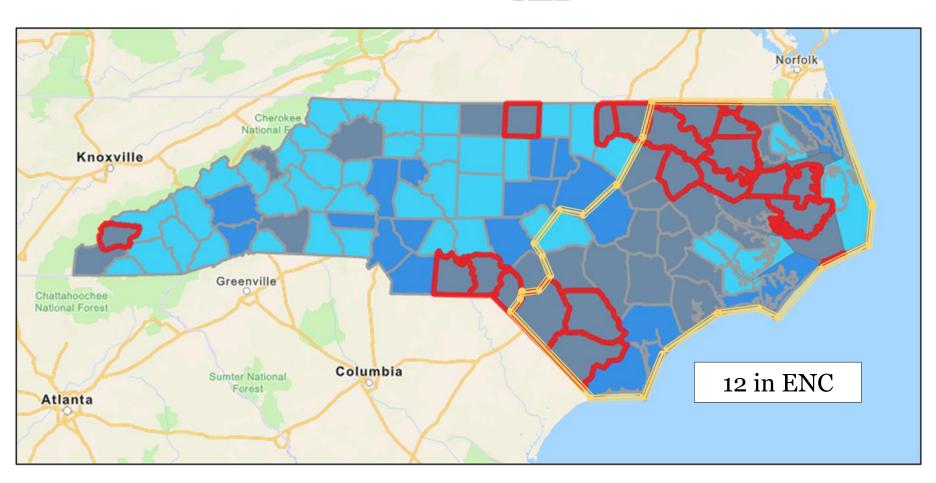

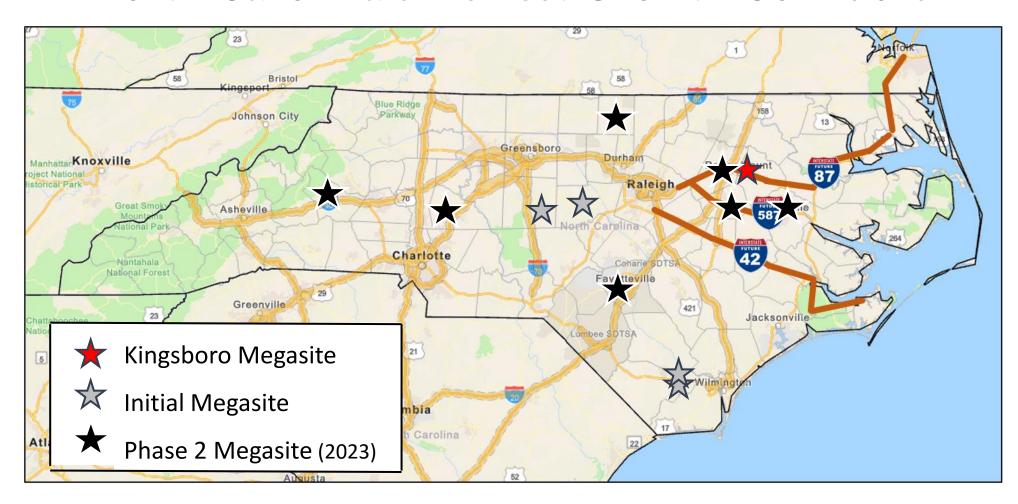

Transforming Economic Development In the East

- "New" Economic Development Assets
 - I-42 and I-87
 - 4 NC Megasites
 - State identified and supported
 - Great marketing tools for entire region
 - Potential for suppliers
- Private developers looking to the East
- Potential for sites to become available
 - End of Tobacco Buyout direct payments to farmers
 - Solar facilities 20 year leases will begin to expire

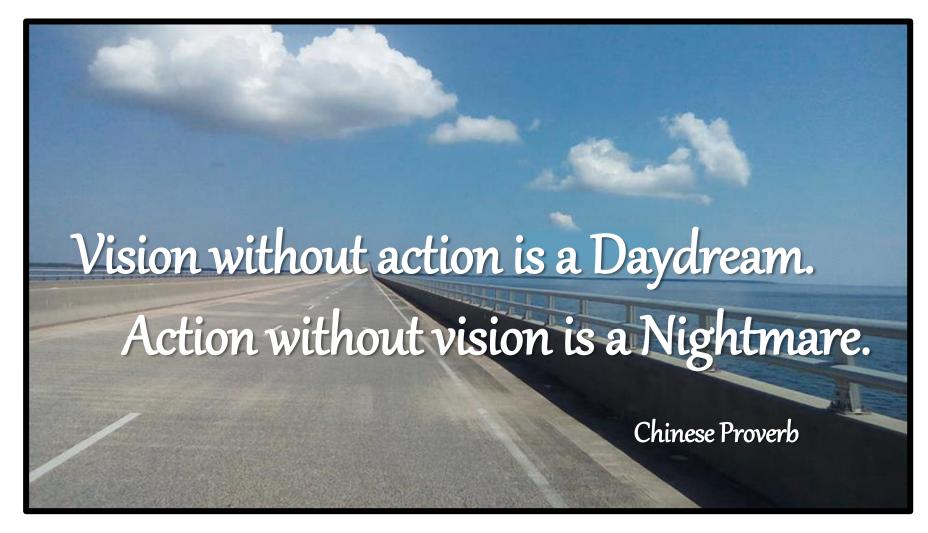


- Take Care of Business
 - Don't shoot ourselves in the foot
 - We take best sites for *public use*
 - Need to protect growth corridors
 - Competition for domestic water / sewer and for buildable sites
 - Local regulators need to be our friends
 - As ED professionals, WE are responsible for taking the long view
 - Think ahead for your companies



- Take Care of Business
 - Provide complete and accurate information
 - Update on a regular basis
 - Policy makers adjust priorities as required
 - Shell buildings are now critical to Tier 1 counties
 - Must, Must, Must apply for grants at every opportunity
 - Spoon-feeding does not work
 Need to fully fund projects over years, not decades
 - Need someone (State, Golden LEAF, other) to <u>come to the</u> table first





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
