- Enroll in the NC Economic Development Certification course via East Carolina University.

- Participate in extra activities at the Conferences to develop individual relationships with members from all levels of experience.

- Participate in events throughout the year and special receptions at conferences to estalish a relationship with the Board of Directors.
- Enroll in the NC Economic Development Certification course via East Carolina University.
